Remembering the 50th Anniversary Celebrations of 2017



2017 witnessed the milestone of fifty years of our amazing village. And what a year it was!

It all began back in Summer 2016 when the VA called a meeting of clubs, societies and organisations within the village to discuss what could be done to celebrate. I was invited along having generated a list of fifty event ideas of my own. Many further ideas were suggested at the meeting and several clubs offered to take on an event and help organise it.

A grant was obtained from the Big Lottery.

However the prospect of organising so many celebrations was daunting and

a '50th Anniversary Steering Committee' was created to oversee the planning and to support the individual event organisers. Led by Ken Smith and myself, Shaun Fishenden, we supported the clubs and individuals who had very kindly offered to organise an event wherever we could.

The celebrations started in June with the Enchanted Orchards Day, held in our wonderful community orchard, an often under-used asset of our village. Then we moved onto the much loved Village Day, which this year was bigger and better than before as it was launching the 50th Celebrations!

Remembering the 2017

After the launch, we saw the celebrations come thick and fast. The next big event was the 'Fifty Shades of Green' revue put on by local drama group Act One. And I must say so myself it was pretty amazing! I had the pleasure of watching it twice - it was a great way to laugh at the quirks of the village.

Then as the warmer weather came we saw the focus move to events for the kids such as the Tennis Taster Days held on the 22 and 23 July. It was a great way to try out the sport and hopefully the club picked up some new members.



A Tea Party was then held by the scouts for the Senior Citizens of the village. It was a great afternoon and the big band was enjoyed by many.

The return of the Inter-Neighbourhood Quiz was won by Capelands, with Manor Forstal as runner up by just one point!

The Shape of New Ash Green Exhibition held in late July, organised by local artist Sam Hickman and photographer Sass Harding was also a very inspiring event. It was nice to see that Sam and Sass had invited the primary school children to contribute artwork to form part of their exhibition - a very nice touch.

The 5th August saw theatre company Shooting Star Entertainments visit the village to perform a custom performance of Robin Hood. 'Nursey' the dame was a particular highlight with the children.



Celebrations...

Entering into September we had the Fun and Food for the Fiftieth day, organised by the Town Team and held in the Shopping Centre.

The 1967 Film Night was held a couple of weekends later, kids were entertained by the adventures of Mowgli in the Jungle Book, whilst adults spent the evening thrilled with the escapades of Sean Connery in James Bond 'You Only Live Twice'.

One of our concluding events was the audio-visual presentation by Patrick Ellard entitled 'A Time It Was And What A Time It Was'. It covered the concept of New Ash Green in the 60s through to the dark days of SPAN's collapse. This was arguably one of the best attended events with a re-run of the presentation having to be held to allow those who missed it the first time to attend. It was truly a remarkable presentation that captured New Ash Green's place in the history books of the 1960s.

Then we moved to our penultimate event, the 50th Anniversary Dance held at the Pavilion on the 30th September. Organised by Muriel (the VA treasurer) who very bravely took on the



mammoth task of organising the event. It provided a fitting finale to the 50th Anniversary and many villagers attended the event and were entertained by Firebird, a local band joined by singer Shane Hampshair. The anniversary dance was a great way to finish off the three months worth of celebrations.

Outside of the event schedule, we had the special 50th Anniversary edition of the ARGUS. This was released on the 21st September 2017, the date when it was exactly

50 years since the launch of New Ash Green.

New Kitchen for Village Hall

The Village Association was delighted to be presented with a brand new kitchen for New Ash Green Village Hall as part of the Anniversary celebrations.

Bovis Homes and **Moore's** teamed up to provide a new kitchen at absolutely no cost.



The existing kitchen had been in place since the village hall first opened back on 19 September 1975 and was no longer suitable for the users of the hall.

The new kitchen which is almost twice the size of the existing one, contains a brand new oven and grill, flooring, sink and utility area. A serving trolley and tea urn has also been purchased by the VA for use by users of the hall.

A handover of the new kitchen was held

on 20 June, attended by representatives from the VA and Bovis Homes. The kitchen was formally presented by Earl Sibley (Bovis Finance Director).

The VA would like to thank both Bovis Homes and Moore's for their generosity in providing the new kitchen as it enables us to better serve the needs of the community and hall users.

Did You Know?

Bovis built the hall and donated it to the village all the way back in 1975!



In October 2017, the **Women's Institute** gifted this knitted mural to the VA which can now be seen proudly on display in the Village Hall.

At the beginning of 2017, a conversation was held with a member of the local Women's Institute about knitting something to commemorate the 50th Anniversary.

The excellent members of the WI went away and the VA office had a complete surprise when presented with the final masterpiece. Chairman's Report: 2016-2017

Keith has served as Chairman since 2015.

As I write, the 50th Anniversary celebrations are drawing to a close. In my previous report I said I hoped to report on a bumper year and I can confirm this is the case and we have indeed celebrated a vintage year in our history.

50th Anniversary

We started with Village Day, before moving onto the Cobbs Bike Show and the events put on by our various Sports Clubs. An inter-neighbourhood quiz saw Capelands crowned the winners. A revue by Act One and a Summer Panto pleased both young and old. SPAN Historian; Patrick Ellard packed out the Village Hall for two showings of his audio-visual history of New Ash Green during the 1960s and 70s. A SPAN original residents meal followed the first showing on the 23 September which was a great success with much reminiscing involved.

The final event arranged by the 50th Committee was the Anniversary Dance held at the Pavilion on 30 September. It proved to be an excellent event held in a marquee that held the

guests, band and singers: A fitting end to our celebrations!

Hardland

Work has continued to maintain our ageing infrastructure and keeping things safe. Vandalism in the play areas has proved to be a particular problem and comments on social media about the type of play equipment in place currently has been noted.

Greenland

Another season of mowing within the village is drawing to a close albeit slowly as the mowing season gets longer each year!

The team lost a long-serving staff member this year meaning they are a man down but are coping well with the workload. New mowers have been purchased to replace ageing equipment enabling grassed areas to continue to be maintained.

The team lead by Paul Yeoman are to be commended in their endeavours to maintaining a high standard in their work. This is proven by visitors to the village who comment on how beautiful it is.

Village Hall

The plan to extend the kitchen was successfully carried out this year. We owe a debt of gratitude to Bovis who supplied and fitted the kitchen. Also to Cllr David Brazier who secured funding from KCC that was used to complete internal fitting. I am delighted to report we did this work at no cost to the village.

Sports Pavilion

The Pavilion continues to make good progress on a sounder financial footing this year and I am delighted to report the hard work and time expended is showing positive results in terms of increased footfall, increased bookings for events and an improvement in the financial health. The team led by Sarah provide a welcoming environment whether you are there for a meeting, a celebration or just a quiet pint.

Policing

Policing continues to be a concern and this year we have seen an increase in the number of incidents of vandalism and anti-social behaviour. Our compliment of PCSO's has increased to 2 but the area they cover has also increased so the net effect to the Village is no change.

Administration

The VA office is the engine room of the village and without the efforts of Pat and Jo it simply could not function. Pat's skills and knowledge is the stuff of legend. Jo has steadily made progress on dealing with outstanding contributions this year.

I close by thanking my fellow directors for their help and support over the year. It is rare to single out particular people but I would like to add a special thanks to Ken Smith for his work on the 50th Anniversary and to Muriel Galinis for her unstinting work as the VA Treasurer and her help with the 50th Celebrations for without her we simply could not have done what we have.

2018: Plans for The Year

2018 will be much quieter than 2017 as there will be no 50th Celebrations but work continues at the VA in maintaining the high standards within the village.

Millfield Lane

Following the VA's first attempt at securing planning consent for new parking bays along Millfield Lane being refused, a consultation with planning officers at Sevenoaks District Council has taken place and a revised scheme will be submitted shortly.

Anti-Social Behaviour

The VA will continue to work in partnership with other agencies to find solutions to the current issues relating to anti-social behaviour in the village.

Greenland Ploughs Ahead

The Greenland team will continue to carry out planned works during 2018 that are

identified during an annual tree survey carried out by an external Arboricultural (Tree) Consultant.

50th Anniversary Video

The 50th Anniversary Video is still going ahead. The majority of the celebrations were filmed which is why there has been a delay in the release but editing has begun. The video will be released in Spring 2018. Please keep an eye out for the official premiere date where the video will be played for the first time in the Village Hall.

We will be displaying a trailer for the video on the New Ash Green & Hartley Friends Facebook group very soon. Keep your eyes peeled!

Sorry For The Silence

We are sorry that we did not publish any VA Newsletters during 2017. With the 50th Celebrations taking place we had hoped to put out a

celebratory issue but we just got so busy with the events it didn't happen. However 2018 will see a return to the twice yearly newsletter to keep residents up to date.

As you can see we have updated the design to make sure it's engaging and modern. We hope you like it!

And whilst we didn't publish last year, the VA was very pleased to see the ARGUS make a special return in 2017. And what a wonderful 50th Anniversary issue it was.

Lights Out

Reporting issues with village lighting

As we are in the darker months, it is important lights around the village are working properly. Therefore when there is a problem with them we strive to fix them quickly!

If you find a light isn't working, you must inform the **VA Office** as soon as possible; this can be done either by visiting the office, email or phone. We have also launched a Report a Light page on our website at www.nagval.com/reportalight

You do not need to report the light to your Residents Society, lighting is the responsibility of the VA and so needs to be reported direct to us.

The information that we need when you report a light is:

- **Location**
e.g. Garage of No.36 Millfield or pathway by No. 20 Chapel Wood
- **The Problem**
Not working, timing issue or vandalised
- **Type of Light**
There are three main types of light around the village: **bollard**, **column** and **bulkhead**.

Please Note - There are also Mushroom Lights on Punch Croft and Globe Lights around the Shopping Centre/Village Hall.

Cop Spot

In recent months the village has seen a significant increase in the amount of anti-social behaviour and crime taking place. The VA recognises that there is a lack of policing within the village and that many of you have not seen either a Police Officer or PCSO in months!

However, we have concerns that incidents are not getting reported therefore the police presence is unlikely to increase. We urge all residents who are affected by a crime to please report every incident to the Police via 101. Whilst it is accepted that the reporting procedure can be difficult and time consuming, increased policing will never be considered until crime statistics justify an increased presence.



Call The Police, Not Social Media

Whilst the VA do not agree with this and believe that actually prevention is better than cure it is the only hope we have of seeing an increase in policing.

Currently we are finding that many incidents are being posted about on social media however they are not being reported to the Police. Whilst social media is a good way of raising people's awareness about these incidents it is not helping us achieve greater levels of policing.

So to report a crime that has taken place you can either;

This online reporting tool is relatively new and we believe there have been teething issues with it but these should soon be resolved.

Money Matters

Muriel has lived in the village for 40 years and raised her two children here.


As Treasurer she is responsible for managing the VA budget and allocating funds to each operation of the association such as Hardlands and Greenlands

The Village Association held its 47th Annual General Meeting on the 8th November 2017 at which the Statutory Accounts for the year ending 31st December 2016 were tabled and approved.

The spending committees prepared budgets for expenditure in 2018 and after full discussion; a proposal was put before the AGM to increase the contribution rate by 3.30%. The annual contribution rate per 100 square feet internal floor space will therefore increase from £18.20 to £18.80. This equates to an annual increase of 60p per annum per 100sq.ft.

Contribution arrears at the end of 2017 amounted to **£99,943.25**. This is the highest figure of outstanding monies the Village Association has ever experienced. What this means is the maintenance programme in the village will become severely delayed. We kindly request that you pay your contributions promptly or perhaps you may wish to consider paying your fees by monthly standing order. The pie chart below shows how the contributions for 2018 will be spent. The VA's improvement programme will continue into this year with works including phase 2 of the three year column light repaint, the crossing barriers being repaired and repainted. In addition the play area by Lambardes will receive a much needed upgrade with new metal fencing and a repaint. The other play areas will also be repaired and re-painted. There will also be a continuation of the upgrade to lights throughout the village.



In my last report, I referred to the plans to provide additional parking bays on Millfield Lane. Our original plans were rejected on the grounds that the proposal: *"Would fail to conserve local character, it would result in a loss of local open space, remove trees which form a key part of local character and access paths required"*

Have Your Say:

Do you want the landscaping to stay or do you want more parking? Your support will help. The schemes are on display in the VA Meeting Room and new plans have been drawn up taking into account the comments received and will be submitted in due course. The funds will be carried forward from last year should approval be received.

Who's Who?

The Organisations Within the Village

We understand it can get confusing as to who is responsible for what within the village as there is no comparable structure in other areas. Below we explain three key organisations; the **Village Association**, **Residents Societies** and **NAG Social**.

New Ash Green Village Association Limited:

The Village Association (VA) owns all amenity land within the village ie. all land *except* houses, rear gardens and garages but including front garden areas, garage courts and parking areas.

The Association's other responsibilities are:

- Maintaining land between residential neighbourhoods including the Sports Field, the Minnis, the woodlands and play areas.
- Street and Path lighting around the Village
- All footpaths not within the responsibility of a neighbourhood
- Managing the Village Hall

The VA is **NOT** responsible for the Shopping Centre.

Contributions known as 'VA Fees' are paid by each householder to fund the operations.

The amount payable by householders depends on property size and are set each year at the Annual General Meeting.

The VA is managed by the Council of Management (COM), these are the elected board of directors accountable to VA members. COM is responsible for ensuring all legal duties (Companies Act, Employment Legislation and Health & Safety) and contractual obligations (Covenants to maintain village grounds) are fulfilled. The Council consists of nine members made up from members of Residents Society committees and from Consultant Members.

Residents Societies:

The village of New Ash Green is made up of groups of houses known as 'neighbourhoods'. Each neighbourhood is different, according to its position, layout and style. There are 24 neighbourhoods in total, each with its own Residents Society.

Residents Societies are covenanted to maintain all land within their boundary, as a result their responsibilities are:

- Greenland (including Landscaping and Trees)
- Footpaths within the Neighbourhood
- Garage Forecourts
- Parking Areas
- External Repaints (including Garages) on a four year cycle

The income a Residents Society receives is from 'subscriptions' charged to all properties within its neighbourhood, fixed annually at the Society's AGM, which is usually calculated on the size of the property. Each Society is run by a committee and budgets are agreed each year in respect of the subscriptions paid to the Society by residents to fund this operation.

New Ash Green Social Committee:

A volunteer run group who organise the annual Village Day, Fireworks Night and Christmas Craft afternoon. NAG Social does not have any responsibility for the village and is financially independent from the VA and Residents Societies. Pavilion is a public bar and sports venue that has catered for families since the 1980s. Not many know but it is actually owned by residents as the Sports Pavilion is a subsidiary of New Ash Green Village Association.

Set over two floors, it has three bars with commanding views across the large sports field. The upstairs bar and Green Room both have Sky Sports channels. In the summer months the outdoor seating area is opened up allowing you to relax outside.

Alongside the public bar there are two function rooms; the Ash Room and the Green Room available for hire. Catering can be done in-house for events in the 5 Star hygiene rated kitchen.

There is an outdoor gym suitable for all ages that was opened in 2015 funded by the Big Lottery, SDC and KCC. Next door is a children's play area for the younger ones.

Nestled in 15 acres of open green fields, our unrivalled rural surroundings and function facilities provide the perfect setting for a variety of family celebrations, music events and sports.

In 2017, the Pavilion invested in refurbishing the Ladies Toilets to bring them up to a clean, high standard. Further refurbishment will take place in 2018 to the public areas.
